Greetings everyone!





First of all, let me briefly give you a recap from last month. At our meeting we had a very informative presentation given by Becky Peak on a warbler mist-netting project in Chiapas province of Mexico. She explained to the group about the work that they are doing in Central America regarding the wintering grounds of the Golden Cheeked Warbler. Becky helped the group to understand how the nets they use are configured and how they go about trying to catch these true Texas birds in mid and upper story canopy. For our field trip we went to Hornsby Bend in Austin where we were led by Eric Runfeldt on a tour of the ponds; the group saw great numbers and diversity of water-related birds, including the Bufflehead, Eared Grebe, Northern Shoveler, Greater Yellowlegs, and the Northern Pintail.

Last month I proposed the idea of using our proposed T-shirts as a fundraiser for TLAS and we voted unanimously to purchase 40 of them and sell to the individuals for \$10. I am happy to report that the T-shirts have been ordered and will be available at our December meeting for those that have already ordered as well as for anyone who is interested in buying one. The T-shirts will be available at future meetings, or on request, until all are sold.

In the afternoon of 4 December, Fort Hood Game Warden Richard Hoover spotted two large swans on a pond at West Fort Hood. In response, Gil Eckrich, Crystal Hammond, and Sabrina Nicholson were very fortunate to see and photograph two juvenile Tundra Swans. The conditions were miserable, the trails slick and muddy; but, these two birds made it all worthwhile. Thanks Game Warden Hoover!



To get an idea of the size of these birds, compare them to the American Wigeon in the photo.

Randy Pinkston reports that he had received a picture of a winter hummer coming to a Stillhouse Hollow backyard feeder. Image quality was not so great but it looked like a female. It had been present for about a week.

Early on 3 Dec, in drizzling rain Randy arrived to check out this bird. A hummer soon appeared and perched on the feeder, but careful scrutiny revealed a young male Rufous. After about 20 minutes the Calliope appeared and allowed the attached photos, also poor quality as I was shooting with flash through a window. Nevertheless, the ID is certain and this was a county first for me. The Rufous returned again to confirm the presence of two good hummers.

He also reports other good birds this weekend include a first-cycle Herring Gull and FOF Bonaparte's Gulls at Temple Lake Park (Lake Belton), Merlin at Dana Peak Park on Stillhouse Hollow, several siskins in a goldfinch flock along Crows Ranch road, and two Dunlins on what remains of the lake along Farmers road in e. Bell.



Crystal Hammond reports that in the afternoon of 1 Dec, she saw 30 American White Pelicans circling around Dana Peak.
