January has had a few cooperative Vermillion Flycatchers along Witter and some weather extremes. I have been enjoying the occasional cruise in south Bell County, inspecting each perched hawk in hopes of finding an interesting one. So far, they are all Red tails. But there is always a possibility of more interesting Harlans or Kriders to get you excited. I would encourage anyone interested in hawks to take the time to look at each one. The diversity within the red-tail species is amazing, and how numerous they are.

Our speaker this month is Dr. David Cimprich, Fort Hood's lead biologist for the Black-capped Vireo, and he will discuss the recent delisting of the species. This is a MUST presentation, considering David's immense wealth of knowledge and his ability to communicate. He will also talk about this year's banding demonstration on Fort Hood.


